

Friends International Center Ramallah



FICR is based in the hundred-year-old Meeting House in Ramallah. From there it works for peace through nonviolent action— believing that creating just relationships is the way forward. This is an active and demanding ministry. It confronts injustice and challenges the 'violence of silence,' by speaking truth out loud.

The Center employs a co-ordinator and part-time assistant, actively campaigns, publishes a newsletter, runs education programmes and provides a venue for talks, concerts and community activities. It brings together Palestinians, Israelis, Christians, Muslims and those of other faiths and none. It helps its many visitors, from near and far, to understand the darkness and light around them. Indeed, the Center is a light over the darkness – and never is its light more needed.

Quaker Voluntary Action

QVA runs two ten-day 'working retreats' in Palestine/Israel each year that are supported by, and give support to, the International Center. At each one, ten adults from abroad experience life under occupation and do practical work such as olive picking and engage in spiritual reflection. They meet Israelis and Palestinians from all walks of life including peace groups that are working for a nonviolent end to the occupation.



These retreats give a 'new dimension' to understanding.



Participants are deeply disturbed by the occupation— the new settlements, house demolitions, severe water rationing and everyday hold-ups at checkpoints. And they are deeply moved, too, by the dignity of the people they meet and their resilience in the face of oppression. The overall experience can be life changing. Participants are stirred to new action when they return home – to

speaking out and supporting new initiatives. This appeal is one of them. QVA wishes to do more in this region.

Both charities need funds to continue and expand this work. The International Centre needs most.
